This usually refers to the first series of books transcribed and collected by students at Berkeley College of Music in the 1970s. they were often more community-oriented and dance groups rather than jazz ensembles, and devoted a lot of space to show melodies, novelty melodies, traditional jazz, etc. For this reason, the books were quickly accepted among jazz musicians in the 1970s, especially on the east coast. The original Real Book volumes, like previous fake books, were printed without securing copyright releases or paying royalties, and so they were illegal. All these unlicensed books were sold through informal connections, for example, for cash in music stores and between musicians. In 2004, Real Book was acquired by publisher Hal Leonard and licensed for legal sale. Many new volumes were eventually added to the series, and some of the known bugs in the original volumes were corrected. These books also inspired a similar series, offered by Sher Music Co., called The New Real Book. This book is withdrawn in editions in accordance with the instruments B♭, E♭, F and C (concert step), as well as bass key and voice editions (low and high voice, with texts). Each edition is paginated equally. The compositions of Steve Swallow, Paul Blay and Chick Corea are widely represented in The Real Book with jazz standards and classical jazz compositions. These were the songs that played most in Boston in the early 1970s, when the book was written. When Swallow was asked about his origins in February 2018, swallow said the book was written by students at Berkeley who wanted to make money. They asked permission to use some of his songs, and he agreed. Swallow asked Blay and Steve Kuhn if they wanted to include some of their songs, and they did; so that's all lead sheets. Swallow helped briefly with editing. Then I saw how these guys finally put together the book. One of them had a beautiful manuscript, which later became a classic - it is called the Font Real Book, and it imitates his hand with supernatural precision. It went on to be a great time copywriter of music in Hollywood... The irony is that soon after the book was put out, some other people realized that they could photocopies and sell it themselves, and the two guys who did all the work and put the book together made far less money than they had hoped because there were imitations of Real Books there almost immediately... The real book was imperfect; there were wrong changes throughout this, but it was extremely more accurate than what existed before. And also, it was a lot more legible: it was easy to read. Only the first volume is original. The following two volumes of The True Book were released. Volume 2 is printed in characteristically coarse handwriting and transcription, while the third volume is typed on a computer. Transcriptions in a real book are not licensed; musicians whose songs appear in the book are not paid royalties. Consequently, the book infringes copyright and is therefore illegal. In the past, it is usually sold secretly in local music stores, often hidden behind the counter for customers who requested. PDF editions of books are often available illegally on P2P networks. The title is likely to play on words from the common title for these types of folio song: a fake book. But this could be influenced by Boston's alternative weekly newspaper The Real Paper, started by the authors of the Phoenix newspaper in Boston after a labor dispute. Different dates were attributed to the book. The April 1990 issue of Esquire featured The Real Book in The Man in his best column by Mark Roman in an article titled Clef Notes. He stated, I don't know a jazzman who at least once in his career has not owned, borrowed or borrowed pages from a real book, and quoted John F. Voigt, a music librarian at Berkeley. This book was published around 1971. The only material available in print was. Another feature surfaced on April 10, 1994 in an article for The New York Times Flight Below the Copyright Radar. Guitarist Bill Wurzel said: Everyone has one, but no one knows where they came from. The author of the article, Michael Lydon, said: I got mine in 1987 from a bassist who lives in queens and who studied at the Berkeley School of Music in Boston; many in jazz circles suspect that students reproduced the first copies of it in the mid-1970s. Pat Metini claims that while teaching at Berkeley College of Music from 1973 to 1974, one of his guitar students and one of Gary Burton's vibraphone students (both of whom want to remain anonymous) came up with the idea of creating an anthology that will form the Real Book. Editions included several compositions as Untitled Tune as they have not yet been recorded and released. In 2004, Hal Leonard's version of Hal Leonard won the rights to most of the tunes contained in the original Real Book, and published the first legal edition, calling it the Real Book Sixth Edition in tacit recognition of five previous illegal versions. The cover and binding are identical to the old real book, and the books use a font similar to the handwritten style of the originals, although the new editions are more legible. Other major improvements are that most editing errors have been corrected, and each melody has been licensed, and copyright holders are paid to use their intellectual property. One hundred and thirty-seven tunes are missing in the 6th edition, which were in the 5th, while 90 new tunes were added. Hal Leonard released The Real Book, Volume II, Second Edition in response to The Real Book, Volume II. These books contain most of the same material as their colleagues, and in most cases the diagrams from Hal Leonard's books are compatible with the Real Book charts. In some cases, compatibility issues occur when some errors have been corrected in the charts of the 5th edition; in other cases, the 6th edition charts may refer to changes to more or more authoritative records.
